

Forth Naturalist and Historian – Membership Scheme

The Forth Naturalist and Historian (FNH) is a charitable organisation registered as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) (SCO13270). The society has worked since 1975 to promote the understanding of and care for the natural, historical and cultural

heritages of the Forth Valley and its surroundings. We do this by means of publications, conferences, exhibitions and activities. These include the presentation of the annual "Man and the Landscape" Conference, publishing of the annual Forth Naturalist and Historian Journal each year, the coordination of the Wildlife & Landscape Forum, now biennial, and the development of a Local History & Archaeology Forum. The FNH operates through a voluntary Board. We need your support in continuing and expanding our work. Changes in the financial support we received has threatened our activities. In 2011 the Board welcomed the proposal to open the organisation to members, who may also wish to join the Board. We hope that by this new constitution, the FNH will become more inclusive and more enterprising by widening attendance at the conference, encouraging contributions from organisations and individuals to the *Journal*, extending the scope of both the Wildlife & Landscape and Historical & Archaeological Forums and pursuing new initiatives. The Board has three main aims in addition to providing a focus for activities and publications concerned with the wildlife, environment and heritage of the Forth area:

- increasing the involvement of individuals in our activities;
- offering involvement to organisations, including the local business community
- ensuring that sufficient funds are generated to meet our costs (we are not a profitmotivated organisation).

Membership entitles you to:

- receive a copy of the FNH journal (as agreed at the AGM 2017)
- attend the Annual General meeting at the annual conference
- influence and contribute to our activities
- free access to that year's Forum.

Membership: Open to any individual or organisation at an annual fee of £12

In addition, the Board members proposed that a limited number of Honorary Memberships would be offered by FN&H either for outstanding services to the FN&H or in recognition of outstanding work for the natural or cultural heritage of the Forth Valley. These would confer free of charge the privileges of individual membership.

The membership year will run from 1^{st} January -31^{st} December.
